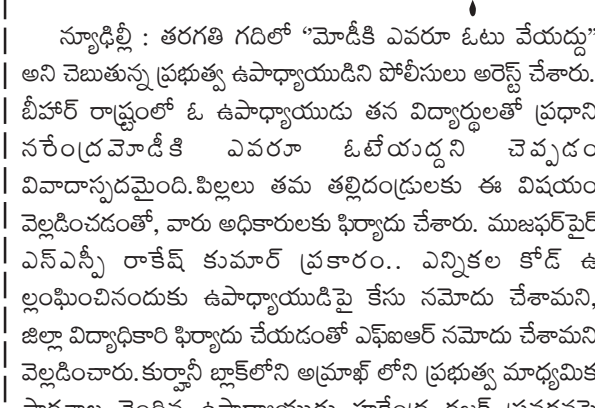

Terrorist's brother makes appeal from polling booth in Baramulla

Lok Sabha Elections 2024: As voting was underway in the Baramulla Lok Sabha constituency on Monday (May 20), a man, whose brother had joined the terror outfit Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), appealed to the him to surrender in the interest of peace and return home, after casting his vote in the seat in Jammu

and Kashmir. Rouf Ahmad Lone, the voter, is the brother of Umar Lone, who is an active LeT terrorist, wanted in several militancy-related cases.

What did the man say?

"Voting is my right, so I cast my vote. I appeal to everybody to cast their vote as developmental works will take place

after that. Come to the polling booths and don't waste your vote," Lone told reporters in Pattan in the north Kashmir district. Raising his finger smeared with the indelible ink, Rouf appealed to his brother to put down arms and return to his family. "I appeal to my brother Umar to surrender (before security

forces). If he does so, it will be much better, he will return to his mother and family," Lone said. In April this year, Umar's mother also issued an appeal to him to surrender before the forces. Over 21.30 percent of the 17.37 lakh electorate cast their vote in the first four hours of polling in the Baramulla

Mother sues American Airlines after son's death on flight



A woman from New York has sued American Airlines after her 14-year-old son died following a medical emergency on a flight. According to the lawsuit the aircraft's defibrillator was not working and that the flight crew was not properly trained to use it. As per the New York Post, 14-year-old Kevin Greenidge was flying home to New York City with his family from a summer vacation in Honduras. While being in midair, he suddenly lost consciousness and went into cardiac arrest. The teen's mother claims the flight crew didn't respond quickly to her calls for assistance and faced difficulties using the defibrillator. The plane was diverted to Cancun, Mexico, where the teen was taken to a hospital, but unfortunately, he was pronounced dead. Greenidge suffered from asthma and type 2 diabetes. His primary cause of death was listed as myocardial infarction. The lawsuit states that his death was caused only because of the carelessness, recklessness, and negligence of the defendant. The lawsuit further stated, when crewmembers eventually attempted to use the plane's automated external defibrillator (AED), they were unable to properly operate the machine or the machine did not function accurately. According to eyewitnesses, every time the AED gave a clear warning for people to step back from Greenidge's body so that a shock could be administered, a shock was not delivered. The lawsuit further alleges that the airline violated its own policy by withholding a \$113,100 advance payment due to the mother following the passenger's onboard death. "After my son died, I never heard from American Airlines. It made me feel hopeless. I want answers from American Airlines. I want American Airlines to take full responsibility for Kevin's death. I never want this to happen to a child or family again," the teen's mother Melissa Arzu said. American Airlines declined to comment over the litigation, but said their thoughts are with Mr. Greenidge's loved ones.

Is the US falling out of love with India?

New Delhi may remain Washington's partner in some areas, but it will never be the proxy the Americans want. After India pursued a deal with Iran on the Chabahar Port, the US responded by threatening New Delhi with sanctions, leading to India's foreign minister accusing Washington of 'bullying.' This rift has exposed the growing geopolitical incompatibility between the two countries over the past several years, even as the US championed India as a critical strategic partner against China. Since 2017, the US has promoted India as one of its key partners. It even went so far as to rename an entire region 'the Indo-Pacific,' eyeing New Delhi as a key strategic asset in its longstanding strategic ambition of containing the rise of China. Thus, India was celebrated for its commitment to democracy, its potential as a new economic and manufacturing giant, and became part of a grouping known as 'The Quad,' alongside Australia and Japan. New Delhi itself was happy to capitalize on these strategic overtures to enable its own economic and political rise as a great power. As the West soured on China, Prime Minister Narendra Modi saw that India's time had come. All of a sudden, however, this newly found optimism for India melted away, despite Western economic engagement with the country growing. New Delhi appears increasingly estranged from US objectives, even to the point that 'The Quad' was recently marginalized in favor of a new grouping, dubbed 'The Squad' with the militantly pro-US Philippines under Ferdinand Marcos Jr taking India's place. It is as if the US believes Manila will do more to cooperate on anti-China objectives than New Delhi, such as joint military exercises. Thus, from close proximity, India appears to be falling into relative estrangement. What happened? First, India has an independent and strictly self-interested for-

eign policy. It might be willing to lean towards the US for its own gain, but that does not make it an 'ally.' The US can subdue many countries into following its foreign policy objectives, such as Britain, the Baltic states, or the Philippines, but India only joins in if it sees fit. Talk of New Delhi being part of an ideological cause for 'democracy and freedom' is nonsense, and its leadership has never seen such cooperation in this way, despite its grievances with China. India has no commitment to US unipolarity like Britain or Australia would support, and instead seeks to rise as a power in its own right in a multipolar world. In doing so, India actively takes positions of disagreement with the US and its allies when it is necessary to do so. Over the past two years, these points of disagreement between New Delhi and the West have surged due to unavoidable changes in the international environment, which have increased geopolitical conflict. India has had an interest in balancing the rise of China, because it recognizes that it can benefit economically from supply-chain and manufacturing realignments. However, when US-led foreign policy begins to attempt to crush all multipolarity for its own benefit, this becomes a strategic problem for India and creates a divergence in the two nations' objectives. One particular example is the war in Ukraine. The US has sought to use the war as a means to attempt to economically and militarily cripple Russia, as nonsensical as this has been proven, thus seeking to eliminate one of India's key strategic partners in the field of energy and armaments. Why would India comply with the US-led sanctions regime? It did not, and even pursued currency changes to avoid it. Ukrainian victory would strategically weaken and isolate India, forcing it into a Western dependency scenario. Worse still, the war has ushered in an improvement in US relations with Pakistan following the removal and



jailing of anti-US Prime Minister Imran Khan. The US, of course, tried to ignore and reconcile these differences for quite a while, even as it leaned on India's shoulder. But then a second issue emerged in this newly fraught geopolitical environment: the Israel-Gaza war. Many Indians support Israel because of the Hindu nationalist dislike for Islam. However, New Delhi also frames itself as a champion of the Global South, and recognizes that it would lose credibility in toeing the Western line of unconditional support for Israel's campaign of genocidal destruction. More importantly though, the situation has also entailed increased Western conflict with Iran, which is another strategic partner of India, a country with which it has historical and cultural ties, and is another critical energy supplier. As US tensions with Iran grow, India will not follow suit on Western pressure. Then finally, to top it all off, a recent Biden gaffe ruffled feathers in India when he called the nation 'xenophobic.' All of this has had the effect of recalibrating India's balancing act on its foreign policy and distancing itself from the US. In conclusion, New Delhi may be a US partner in some areas, but it is not a US proxy. The two countries have very different visions for the emerging new world order. India cannot accept US subjugation or the removal of its own strategic partners from the chessboard, which has quickly stifled Washington's starry-eyed vision of India being the newest global champion of freedom and democracy, in pursuit of a unipolar world.

Mamata's Dig At 'Some Monks' From Ramakrishna Mission, Bharat Sevashram Stirs Row, PM Modi Responds



The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, hit back at the West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Sunday after the TMC chief claimed during an election rally that RK mission monks were aligning with the ruling party at the Centre and adhering to orders from New Delhi. Addressing an election rally in Goghat under the Arambagh Lok Sabha constituency, Bengal CM had claimed, "Some monks of Ramakrishna Mission and Bharat Sevashram Sangha are working under the influence of BJP leaders in Delhi. Those who are looking after temples are doing great spiritual jobs, but everyone is not doing so. This is not done." While speaking at a rally in Purulia, Modi today said the TMC has crossed the limits of decency by stooping so low that it is "spreading canards against ISKCON, Ramakrishna Mission and Bharat Sevashram Sangha". "The TMC has gone beyond its limits by spreading canards against ISKCON, Ramakrishna Mission and Bharat Sevashram Sangha. West Bengal Chief Minister (Mamata Banerjee) is threatening them. They are threatening them just to appease their vote bank," he said. Bengal BJP chief Sukanta Majumdar was the first to respond to Mamata's allegations, saying "Her delusional rants are a travesty for the people of Bengal." "Mamata Banerjee's recent attack on ISKCON, RKM, & Bharat Sevashram Sangh hits a new low. She accuses them of threatening India's future, claims RKM is campaigning for the BJP via WhatsApp. As the CM, her delusional rants are a travesty for the people of Bengal," he said. "Mamata Banerjee is upset and alleges that a few monks from ISKCON, Bharat Sevashram Sangha and Ramakrishna Mission are helping BJP. But last year, during Eid, ahead of 2024 LS polls, the CM called on all Muslims to unite behind TMC and against BJP. Mixing religion and politics?" BJP IT cell chief Amit Malviya wrote on the microblogging website X. "Seems Mamata Banerjee lied yesterday regarding revered Kartik Maharaj of the Bharat Sevashram Sangh. Sangh will now approach the High Court against her for maligning Hindu saints. Sangh helped protect Hindu lives during Bengal's bloody anti-CAA riots. No wonder TMC is mad at them! Hindu organisations will also launch protest against Mamata Banerjee across Bengal for targeting ISKCON, Bharat Sevashram Sangh and Ramakrishna Mission," Malviya said in a subsequent post. "All Hindu organisations must come forward against Mamata's open anti-Hindu rhetoric. Will Mamata Banerjee dare to speak a word against Mohammad Yahya, Chairman of the Bengal Imam Association, who is openly urging Muslims to band together and vote for the TMC? She is preaching neutrality and secularism to Hindu organisations. Will she dare to give similar sermons to her vote-bank?" he added.

SC puts an end to ED's arrest spree

The Supreme Court's order last week which limited the powers of the Enforcement Directorate (ED) to arrest a person accused under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) is in line with some of its other judgements underlining the importance of the right to life and personal freedom. The court held that the ED cannot arrest a person under the PMLA once a special court takes cognisance of its complaint, and the agency will have to approach the court if it wants custody of that person. If an accused appears before the authorities in response to a summons, it cannot be said that the person is in custody, and by extension, it is not necessary for him to apply for bail. It is up to the ED to apply to the court for custody, giving specific reasons. The court also said that an accused who appears in a special court could be exempt from personal appearance in future. The judgement is important because of the arbitrary ways in which the draconian PMLA is being

used by the ED to arrest people and hold them in custody for long. Getting bail is extremely difficult because of two tough conditions: the accused has to prove in court that he is innocent, and also convince the judge that he will not commit an offence while on bail. So to be arrested under the PMLA is to be condemned in jail for years, especially because the conviction rate is low. Many accused persons waste years of their life in jail in such cases. The ED is known to be arrest-happy and has used its power too liberally in the last few years. Opposition politicians, including AAP leaders like Arvind Kejriwal, have been victims of the ED's actions. Though Kejriwal got bail, many others are still in jail, after being repeatedly denied bail. A restraint on the ED's powers of arrest is therefore welcome. The arrest of a citizen involves the constitutional and human rights of that person and so the power to arrest should be used judiciously. The Supreme Court has



said in other cases that unreasonable curbs on freedom even for a day are wrong. In the present case, the court was addressing the question of whether an accused in a money laundering case has to meet the stringent twin-test for bail when a special court has taken cognisance of the case. By ruling that the ED cannot arrest a person once a complaint is filed, the court has prevented many arrests and protected the right to life and personal liberty of citizens. It reduces the scope of the draconian law to curb the fundamental rights of citizens.

Bibhav Kumar arrested as per law brought by AAP: Ally Congress' Sandeep Dikshit invokes Nirbhaya case



Congress leader Sandeep Dikshit, son of former Delhi Chief Minister Sheila Dixit, on Sunday invoked the 2012 Nirbhaya case in reference to an alleged assault on Rajya Sabha MP Swati Maliwal, saying that Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's aide Bibhav Kumar was arrested per the law brought by AAP. Dikshit's remark came at a time when the political war of words between the ruling AAP and

the BJP was at its height. Notably, the Congress is an ally of the AAP in Delhi under the INDIA bloc., Dikshit said only a proper investigation would reveal what exactly went down between Maliwal and Bibhav at the CM's Civil Lines residence. "When the 'Nirbhaya' (horrific and fatal gangrape of a paramedical student in the national capital on December 16, 2012) incident happened, the AAP hit the streets and raised chorus for a law as per which the victim's statement in incidents of sexual crime or violence against women would be taken as the truth and the onus will be on the accused to prove his innocence," Dikshit said. "A legislation to this effect was drafted and brought into force thereafter. However, now, when action follows after a woman alleged that she was wronged, it should be assumed that she was speaking the

truth. Bibhav Kumar was arrested as per this law. The legislation was brought by the AAP, and none else. We have flagged concerns over this legislation earlier," he added. Bibhav was arrested on Saturday for the alleged assault on AAP's Rajya Sabha MP at the CM's residence and has been remanded in police custody for five days. Kejriwal has accused Prime Minister Narendra Modi of playing a 'Jail ka Khel' (game of putting leaders in jail) with the Aam Aadmi Party and had conducted a 'Jail Bharo' march to the BJP's national headquarters today, with top party heavyweights. Maliwal, in her complaint, alleged that Bibhav "slapped" her "at least seven to eight times" while she "continued screaming" and "brutally dragged" her while "kicking" her in her "chest, stomach and pelvis area."

'Shocked by tragic demise of President Raisi, India stands with Iran...': PM Modi

Ebrahim Raisi helicopter crash: Prime Minister Narendra Modi conveyed profound grief on Monday over the death of Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi, the foreign minister, and other high-ranking officials. According to the state media, no survivors were found after the ill-fated helicopter carrying the President and others crashed on Saturday. In a social media post, the Prime Minister lauded his contribution in building the relations between both countries and added India stood with Iran in a time of sorrow. "Deeply saddened and shocked by the tragic demise of Dr. Seyed Ebrahim Raisi, President of the Islamic Republic of Iran. His contribution to strengthening India-Iran bilateral relationship will always be remembered. My heartfelt condolences to his family and the people of Iran. India stands with Iran in this time of sorrow," PM Modi wrote on social media platform, X. Besides, PM Modi, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar also con-



doled the sudden demise of the President and his Iranian counterpart Amir-Abdollahian in the helicopter crash. The Indian foreign minister recalled his last meeting with Raisi and Abdollahian in January this year and echoed New Delhi stood with the people of Iran at the time of this tragedy. "Deeply shocked to hear of the passing away of Iran's President Dr Ebrahim Raisi and Foreign Minister H. Amir-Abdollahian in the helicopter crash," Jaishankar wrote on X. "Recall my many meetings with them, most recently in January 2024.

Our condolences to their families. We stand with the people of Iran at the time of this tragedy," he added.

Iran President killed in helicopter crash

Raisi, a hardliner long seen as a potential successor to Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, was killed in a helicopter crash in mountainous terrain near the Azerbaijan border, state media said on Monday. The charred wreckage of the helicopter which crashed on Sunday carrying Raisi and Foreign Minister Hossein Amirabdollahian was found early on Monday after an overnight search in blizzard conditions. Raisi's death was later confirmed in a statement on social media by Vice President Mohsen Mansouri and on state television. Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, who holds ultimate power with a final say on foreign policy and Iran's nuclear program, had earlier sought to reassure Iranians, saying there would be no disruption to state affairs.
