Justin Trudeau says he thinks about quitting his 'crazy job' daily

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau admitted that he thought of quitting his "crazy job" every day, but he "couldn't be the man I am and give up the fight at this point" and assured of remaining in office until the next general election in 2025. Trudeau's remarks come as he has been facing unfavourable polls for months, while his rival from the opposition Conservative Party Pierre Poilievre taking a commanding lead ahead of the election which is scheduled to be held by October 2025. Trudeau, who assumed office in November 2015, is now facing a daunting task

of securing the trust of millions of Canadians to pull off a fourth election victory. While replying to a query about his political future during an interview with French broadcaster Radio-Canada on Friday, the 52-year-old Trudeau said, "I think about quitting every day. It's a crazy job I'm doing, making personal sacrifices... Of course, it's super tough. It's super boring at times." "If I didn't doubt what I do almost every day, I wouldn't be human," he said, adding, "I could not be the man I am and abandon the fight at this point." While assuring to remain in office until the next

national election, Trudeau said, Democracies are under attack around the world with extreme populism. I entered politics to be there for this fight. Not to be popular, not for personal reasons. I want to serve, and I know that I have something to offer. "The choice that Canadians will make, in a year in the elections, will be so fundamental." One of the key issues where the opposition Conservatives are giving the ruling Liberals a fight is the axing of a planned increase to the carbon tax, a key climate initiative introduced by the Trudeau government slated to come into force in

April. While reiterating that he would move forward with the hike despite opposition from seven provinces, the Prime Minister said, "Yes, I will maintain this increase for the very good reason that the 3 cents per litre (of fuel) that it costs more, we reimburse it to eight out of 10 families in the regions where we have this programme." "It is a measure that not only fights climate change and encourages innovation and improvements in our emissions, but also puts more money in the pockets of eight out of 10 families across the country..."

'It's Not Jaishankar's View, I Express Mood of The Country'

NEW DELHI (ROYAL JOURNALISM): In a newly released podcast, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has outlined the country's 'clear' foreign policy choices made by the Narendra Modi government which have been pivotal in navigating India's interests amid issues like the Ukraine conflict. In an interview released on Thursday, influencer Raj Shamani asked Jaishankar what has prompted "new India's" firm stance - including the purchase of Russian crude - while dealing with world powers on the global stage. "We could have bought the Russian oil clandestinely. We could have said something and could have done something. It would not have been maintainable," the minister said, while interacting with Shamani who has over two million subscribers on YouTube. Russia has been a longstanding and time-tested partner for India, with defence ties with Moscow being a key pillar of New Delhi's foreign policy. Historically, Russia was

a minor exporter of fuel to India but Delhi began boosting shipments after the start of the Ukraine war in February 2022. While expanding trade with Moscow, New Delhi consistently called for "complete cessation of all hostilities". On the issue of Russian oil imports, India has also maintained that it will continue to take calls based on its national interest.

'We are a big country'

The external affairs minister asserted that a country like India should take a clear stand on issues like the Russian oil trade, which is key for the country's energy security. "Today, we are a big country. We are the fifth-largest economy and we are the most populous country. We are looking at a great future ahead. You cannot rise without being clear," he added. In the podcast, the external affairs minister said that when he sits with foreign governments, he explains to them, the adverse impact of sanctions on Russian oil exports and highlights India's



role in stabilising the global market. "Let's say If we would not have bought Russian gas or oil. What would have happened to the global market? We did you guys a favour by buying Russian crude. We have actually stabilised the market," he added.

'Mood of the country'

Further explaining the question on what has prompted India's firm stand on the Ukraine conflict, Jaishankar said, "When you have a team like this, under a Prime Minister like this

(Narendra Modi), one tends to internalise this. When the appropriate time comes, you express it (India's view)," he said. "People may say I said that I said it. But I expressed what is actually the mood of the country. This is not Jaishankar's personal view. The reason people responded was... this is what we feel." Earlier this month, Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov recalled how Jaishankar delivered a strong response to European leaders during a UN speech, telling them "to mind their own business" when they questioned why New Delhi continued to align itself with Moscow. He made these remarks while responding to a question on India's oil purchases during the World Youth Forum in the Russian city of Sochi. During an interactive session, Lavrov stressed the historical ties between the two countries, particularly Moscow's support for New Delhi during the Cold War period.

Situation along LAC stable but sensitive, deployment extremely robust: Army Chief Manoj Pande

New Delhi, : Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande on Friday said he would describe the situation along the Line of Actual Control as "stable but sensitive" while asserting that deployment of Indian troops and other elements along the LAC is "extremely robust" and "balanced". During a panel discussion at a conclave here, he also said "we need to keep a close watch and monitor" what other developments are taking place along the border in terms of infrastructure and movement of troops. At the discussion on 'India and Indo-Pacific: Threats and Opportunities', held as part of the India Today Conclave 2024, the Army chief was asked a range of questions in the context of China's growing influence in the region and the future preparedness of the army "if the situation along the LAC escalates". The eastern Ladakh border standoff erupted on May 5, 2020, following a violent clash in the Pangong Lake area. Ties between the two countries nose-dived significantly following the clash in the Galwan Valley in June 2020 that marked the most serious military conflict between the two sides in decades. Asked what was the current situation at the LAC, Gen Pande said, "Very briefly if I were to sum up as to what the situation



is, I would describe it to be stable but sensitive. And, this is where we need to keep a close watch, monitor very closely the activities across the LAC, both in the immediate, shall we say depth, and further behind." "I would say upfront, our deployment in terms of the troops and other elements that we have along the LAC, is extremely robust and, it is balanced. We also have or we do maintain adequate reserves, in terms of our infantry formation and other artilleries and the other elements, to be able to deal with any situation that may arise across the entire length of the LAC. So, this is as far as our preparedness is concerned," he added. India and China recently held a fresh round of high-level military talks to resolve the border row that witnessed both sides agreeing to maintain "peace and tranquillity" on the ground but there was no indication of any breakthrough. The Army

chief was also asked what lessons have been learnt from tussles at the border, to which he said, not only what is happening along the border, "I would say there are very profound lessons that we need to learn from conflicts happening around the world." "These lessons are at the "strategic level, operational level and tactical level". "At the strategic level, national security is gaining salience in the international system and what it has shown is that when national interests are involved, nations would not hesitate to go to war. Second, in situation where you have contested borders, such as ours, the land will continue to remain a decisive domain of warfare," Gen Pande said. Third is self-reliance, it has shown that not only in this conflict, but also during the pandemic time, "the importance for us to become self-reliant, to have near zero dependency on ex/import requirements". "At the operational level, the importance of non-contact warfare, as we call it non-kinetic warfare... cyber, information space, battle of narratives, influence operations, these are some of the areas. All the lessons we need to see in our context," he said. Asked about a recent international report that claims the situation along the LAC may escalate, the Army chief said, "We do plan

for different contingencies, and for each contingency, the responses would be different". "So, I would not want to get into the specifics as to what the response would be, but leave it by saying that our current deployment... is robust, and we do have response mechanism, for different contingencies that may arise, which also will be equally robust, equally effective," he asserted. And, while what is happening at the border is also important, there is also a need to "keep a close watch and monitor what other developments are taking place in terms of infrastructure, movement of troops, concentration of troops etc, so, this is a constant process, so not only the military in consonance with other intelligence agencies at the strategy level, we have all the wherewithal", Gen Pande said. "So, it is for us to put it all together to make sure that we are neither strategically surprised nor tactically surprised," the Army chief added. Asked if the situation escalates, will Indian military's response will be different than what it was in the 1962 war, he said, "Certainly. Response will be effective and it will be what situation that comes about." Gen Pandey also said there is a need to identify as to how future conflicts will play out,

Indian Navy foils Somali pirates' hijacking attempt, intercepts ex-merchant vessel Ruen

New Delhi [India]: In a daring operation to safeguard maritime security, the Indian Navy successfully thwarted Somali pirates from using an ex-merchant vessel Ruen to hijack ships traversing the region, the Indian Navy spokesperson said. The ex-MV Ruen, which had been commandeered by Somali pirates on December 14, 2023, was reported to have reappeared as a pirate vessel, threatening merchant shipping in the high seas. Responding swiftly to the threat, an Indian Navy warship engaged the pirate vessel on March 15. According to a

statement issued by the Indian Navy, it was revealed that upon interception, the Ruen when intercepted opened fire on the Naval warship, prompting a response from naval officials. Acting in strict accordance with international law and protocols governing maritime security, the Indian Navy retaliated with minimal force necessary to neutralize the pirate threat and ensure the safety of seafarers and shipping lanes. "Indian Navy thwarts designs of Somali pirates to hijack ships plying through the region by intercepting ex-MV Ruen. The

ex-MV Ruen, which had been hijacked by Somali pirates on #14Dec 23, was reported to have sailed out as a pirate ship towards conducting acts of #piracy on high seas," the Navy said in a post on social media platform X. "The vessel was intercepted by the #IndianNavy warship on #15Mar. The vessel opened fire on the warship, which is taking actions iaw international law, in self-defence & to counter piracy, with minimal force necessary to neutralise the pirates' threat to shipping and seafarers. The pirates onboard the vessel have been called upon

to surrender & release the vessel & any civilians they may be holding against their will," it said. The pirates aboard the vessel have been called upon by the Indian Navy to surrender immediately and release any civilians they may be holding against their will. The Indian Navy reiterated its unwavering commitment to maintaining maritime security and ensuring the safety of seafarers navigating through these perilous waters. This action by the Indian Navy serves as a testament to India's resolve to combat piracy and uphold international maritime laws.

- Supreme Court issued notice to State Bank of India
- During the hearing on the Electoral Bonds case, the Supreme Court reprimanded the State Bank of India (SBI) and issued a notice to it, seeking a response by March 18th. The



court questioned why the bank had not disclosed the bond numbers and why it had not provided the alphanumeric numbers. The court ordered SBI to disclose the bond numbers. Additionally, the Supreme Court instructed the Registrar of the apex court to ensure that the documents are scanned and digitized. Once the process is complete, the original documents will be returned to the Election Commission of India (ECI), and the ECI will upload them on its website by March 17th or earlier.

Yasin Malik faction's J-K Peoples Freedom League designated as 'unlawful organisation' for 5 years

New Delhi: The Union Government on Friday designated the Jammu and Kashmir Peoples Freedom League (JKPFL) as an 'Unlawful Organisation' under the anti-terror law for five years. A notification by the Home Ministry said that all factors of the league are involved in promoting, aiding and abetting secession of the Union Territory from India by involvement in anti-national and terrorist activities. According to the Ministry of Home Affairs, four factions of Jammu and Kashmir Peoples League (JKPL) have been indulging in unlawful activities, which are "prejudicial to the integrity, sovereignty and security of the country. All the leaders and members of all factions of the league have been involved in mobilising violent protests in various parts of Jammu and Kashmir for perpetrating unlawful activities, including sustained stone-pelting on security forces, it said. The organisations have also been accused



of sowing seeds of disaffection among people, exhorting people to destabilise public order, encouraging the use of arms to separate Jammu and Kashmir from India, promoting hatred against the government and calling for the boycott of elections on multiple occasions. "The Modi government has designated the Jammu and Kashmir Peoples Freedom League as an 'Unlawful Association' for five years. The organization threatened India's integrity by pro-

moting, aiding and abetting the secession of Jammu and Kashmir through terrorism. The Modi government will remain unsparing to people and organizations involved in terror activities," said Union Home Minister Amit Shah on X.

Why was JKPFL banned?

The Centre said if there are no immediate curbs on JKPL's activities, they will continue with the anti-national activities that are detrimental to the security and sovereignty of the country, continue advocating for the secession of the Union Territory and continue propagating false narratives and anti-national sentiments among the people to cause disaffection against Indian and disrupt public order. The designation against all four factions of the league was made under Section 3(1) of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), 1967. The Centre declared JKPL (Mukhtar Ahmed Waza), JKPL (Bashir Ahmad Tota), JKPL (Ghulam

Mohammad Khan) also known as Jammu and Kashmir Peoples Political League and JKPL (Aziz Sheikh) led by Yaqoob Sheikh as 'unlawful associations' with immediate effect for a time of five years.

Centre extends ban on JKLF

The Centre also extended the declaration of the 'Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front (Mohd. Yasin Malik faction)' as an 'Unlawful Association' for a further period of five years, announced Home Minister Shah. He said the banned outfit continues to engage in activities that foment terror and secessionism in Jammu and Kashmir. "Anyone found challenging the security, sovereignty and integrity of the nation will face harsh legal consequences," he asserted. The JKLF was banned in 2019 under the anti-terror law, days after the Centre banned Jamat-e-Islami (JeI-J&K) under the UAPA law. It is worth mentioning that the 57-year-old Yasin Malik has been charged
