













## 'Those Refugees Who Came From PoK...Sorry...Kashmiri Pandits': Rahul Gandhi's Slip Of Tongue Draws BJP Ire

Senior Congress leader Rahul Gandhi had a slip of tongue during his speech at a rally in Jammu and Kashmir on Wednesday (September 25), where polling for the second phase of the assembly elections is ongoing. Meaning "Kashmiri Pandits", he instead said "refugees from PoK (Pakistan-occupied Kashmir)" and, realising his mistake, quickly corrected himself. Gandhi said the promise made by former prime minister Manmohan Singh to the refugees who have come from PoK will be fulfilled. He then said "sorry" and changed it to the "promise made to Kashmiri Pandits". "Those refugees who came from PoK, the promises made to them by Manmohan Singh will be fulfilled... Sorry... Kashmiri Pandits... promises made to Kashmiri Pandits will be fulfilled," he said at the public gathering. But, this did not go unnoticed and gave plenty of ammo to the ruling BJP. Senior party leader Amit Malviya, in a jibe at Gandhi, said overseas Congress leader Sam Pitroda wants everyone to believe "he is not Pappu anymore". He said the Leader of the Opposition in

Lok Sabha could not distinguish between PoK refugees and Kashmiri Pandits. "Then Sam Pitroda wants us to believe that he isn't Pappu anymore... a man who is the Leader of Opposition can't distinguish between refugees from PoK and Kashmiri Pandits. The mess in Kashmir is a legacy of Jawaharlal Nehru. As if that wasn't enough, we now have Rahul Gandhi also," he said in a post on X with a video of the speech. Andhra Pradesh BJP leader Vishnu Vardhan Reddy said "no matter how hard you try to hide the truth, it eventually comes out". "...Kudos to Rahul Gandhi for speaking the actual truth, even though by mistake.." he wrote on social media. In another post, Reddy said: "So basically, Rahul Gandhi is saying in Jammu that 'the Indian govt is an outsider for the people of J&K, so it's an injustice for them'. But same Congress & their allies always advocate for talks with Pakistan regarding Kashmir. So, for him, the Indian govt is an outsider, but Pakistan is not." Gandhi addressed two rallies in J&K - one in Jammu and the other at Sopore. In both the public gatherings,

Indian veteran wrestler Vinesh Phogat has been issued a notice by the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA). Vinesh is currently busy preparing for the Haryana Legislative Assembly Election 2024. Meanwhile, her tension has increased.

NADA Sends Notice To Vinesh Phogat: Indian veteran wrestler Vinesh Phogat has been in constant discussions for some time now. In the Paris Olympics 2024, she could not win a medal in the women's 50 kg category due to being just 100 grams overweight. After this she announced her retirement. Then she joined the Congress party along with her fellow wrestler Bajrang Punia. Vinesh is now contesting the upcoming Haryana assembly elections from Julana constituency. Meanwhile, her troubles have increased. A notice has been issued to her by the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) and she has been asked to respond within 14 days.

### NADA issued notice to Vinesh Phogat

The National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) has sent a notice to wrestler Vinesh Phogat for failure to provide information about her place of residence and has sought a reply within 14 days. NADA issues this notice in case the athlete does not appear at the scheduled time and place for the dope test as it is considered a violation of the rules. All the players registered in NADA's Registered Testing Pool (RTP) are required to give information about their availability for dope testing and Vinesh is also included in these players. According to the rule, if the player is not available at the place where he has given the information, then it is considered a failure to give information about the whereabouts. In its notice, NADA told Vinesh that she had made a mistake by not giving information about her

place of residence as she was not available for dope testing at her home in Kharkhauda village of Sonapat on September 9.

### Vinesh Phogat has a chance to give clarification

In the notice issued by NADA to Vinesh, she has been given an opportunity to give her explanation before taking a final decision in this matter. NADA's notice said, 'You are given a formal notice to inform about the clear failure to comply with the requirements related to the location of residence under the anti-doping rules. You are asked to explain this before taking a final decision on this matter. A Dope Control Officer (DCO) was sent to that place on that day to investigate you but he was unable to do so because you were not present at that place.' Vinesh will either have to admit the violation or provide evidence that she was present at that place for about 60 minutes. But it can be mentioned here that failure to provide accommodation is not a violation of anti-doping rules. NADA can take any action against the athlete only if a player violates the rules related to venue information three times in 12 months.

## Sanjay Raut Gets 15 Days Imprisonment, 25K Fine In Defamation Case By Medha Kirit Somaiya

A Mumbai court on Thursday convicted Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut in the criminal defamation case on a complaint filed by Dr. Medha Kirit Somaiya, wife of BJP leader Kirit Somaiya. The court has imposed a fine of Rs 25000 on Raut and sentenced him to 15 days of imprisonment in the defamation case. The case was filed by Dr. Medha Somaiya after Raut allegedly made defamatory remarks against her, accusing her and her husband Kirit Somaiya of involvement in a Rs 100 crore corruption case related to the construction of public toilets under Mira Bhayander Municipal Corporation's jurisdiction. On April 12, 2022, Raut had written an article in Samna Online, alleging that Medha Somaiya used political power to get a contract for construction of public toilets under Mira Bhayander Municipal Corporation's jurisdiction and was involved in a corruption case. Dr. Somaiya filed a criminal defamation case against Raut, stating that his article caused her mental stress. She further alleged that her relatives and friends have grown suspicious of her and have started asking her questions after this article by Raut. The complaint further states that these claims by Raut have marred her and her family's image in society. She further told the court that she feels ashamed because of all these developments which are a direct consequence of Raut's defamatory article in Samna. Dr. Somaiya further submitted in court that after Raut's article, a news channel also ran a news piece saying that she was involved in a "toilet scam." She told the court that the article has caused serious harm to her and her family's reputation in society. Today, the Metropolitan Magistrate 25th Court, Mazgaon convicted Sanjay Raut in this complaint filed by BJP leader Kirit Somaiya's wife Dr. Medha Somaiya.

## Bengaluru Horror - 'I Cut Her Body into 59 Pieces': Mahalakshmi Murder Suspect's Diary Found

Bhubaneswar: The main accused in the gruesome murder of 29-year-old Mahalakshmi in Bengaluru whose dismembered body was found in the refrigerator, was found dead, hanging from a tree in Odisha. A diary recovered from the accused, has his written confession of the murder and that he had dismembered the woman's body.

### 'I Cut Her Body into 59 Pieces': Mahalakshmi Murder Case Suspect

The police on Wednesday also recovered a diary, believed to be belonging to the deceased man Mukti Ranjan Ray, in which he confessed to killing the woman whose dismembered body was found in the fridge of her house in the southern metropolis. "We have recovered the body of Mukti Ranjan Ray hanging from a tree. The body was handed over to his family after conducting post-mortem examination," Dhusuri Police Station IIC, Santanu Jena, said. The SP said the police recovered a diary of Ray in which he confessed that he had dismembered the body of the Bengaluru woman to 59 pieces after killing her. He had returned to the village from Bengaluru after the murder.

### Bengaluru Fridge Murder Suspect Found Dead, Suicide Suspected

The Odisha police found a man, the key suspect in the brutal killing of a woman in Bengaluru, hanging from a tree in Bhadrak district, an officer said. Bhadrak SP Varun Guntupalli said Ray (30), a resident of Bhuinpur Village under Dhusuri Police Station, was the prime suspect in the woman's murder. He was allegedly on the run following the discovery of the body parts of Mahalakshmi, a 29-year-old



woman. Earlier on the day, Karnataka Home Minister G Parameshwara had said the police have information about the presence of the suspect in Odisha, and teams formed to crack the case have been sent there to nab him. Asked whether the Karnataka police had contacted Bhadrak police, Jena said, "We had received a message, but no representative of the Karnataka police has reached here." The maggot-infested body of Mahalakshmi, chopped into several pieces and stuffed into the fridge, was found by her mother and elder sister at her Vyalikaval home on Saturday. Victim's Estranged Husband Suspected Mahalakshmi's Affair with Mukti According to sources, Mukti had opposed Mahalakshmi's closeness with another man. However, it is still unknown who the other person was. The deceased woman's estranged husband on Sunday expressed suspicion about the involvement of a man known to Mahalakshmi, who had been living alone, in her neighbourhood. Earlier, Mahalakshmi's estranged husband said he suspected the role of Ashraf, who he had identified as her lover. According to reports, both the husband and the victim were living separately. According to police in Bengaluru, the suspect and the woman were working in a garment shop where they met and become

friends. The two were in a relationship. Mahalakshmi was allegedly pressuring him to marry her. This led to constant arguments between them and led to an altercation. Apparently irked over this, the accused, who is allegedly very short-tempered, killed Mahalakshmi and later dismembered her body, police said, citing preliminary investigation.

### Mahalakshmi Murder Case, Rerun of Shraddha Walker Murder

A Shraddha Walker murder case rerun has surfaced from Karnataka's Bengaluru after a 29-year-old woman's chopped body into over 50 pieces was found stuffed in a refrigerator of a room. According to the police, the incident may have happened 4-5 days ago and is being probed as a murder. Amid this, a video has surfaced showing how victim woman Mahalakshmi's family including her mother and sister found about the incident. In the 44-second clip, her mother and sister are seen entering the room where she was staying. They took a round in the 1-room set which was smelling badly. Looking for their daughter, one of the persons opened the fridge and were shocked to see her body parts stuffed inside the refrigerator. They rushed outside shouting. Senior police officers reached the spot and barricaded the road leading to the building where the body was found in a single bedroom house, where the victim was staying alone. Police suspect it to be a case of murder, which took place about a week ago. An investigation has been launched into the case. The incident was a stark reminder of the brutal murder of Shraddha Walker by her live-in partner Aftab Poonawalla on May 18, 2022 at Mehrauli in Delhi.
